TEMPLE UPDATE

As I mentioned in my last update, the Marysville Buddhist Church Board of Directors met on July 11th and then again on August 9th. We again started off our Board meeting with a short service before the meeting.

Closing the temple during this COVID crisis was one of the most difficult decisions the MBC Board has ever made. Yet at the same time, it was an easy decision as we knew protecting the health and safety of our Sangha is our goal. It is that same goal that makes opening up the MBC again for services so very difficult and yet easy.

Since our last meeting, Governor Newsom and the State of California have again placed restrictions on churches to allow only outdoor services with other social distancing and safety rules in place. Even our insurance company sent us a reminder that the Governor placed this restriction on churches in Yuba County.

The MBC Board has been busy developing the opening protocols that will ensure that our Sangha has a safe place to come to when we reopen. We continue to purchase the cleaning supplies and equipment that will be necessary to clean our temple.

We must all play a role in only coming to the MBC for service, events, and volunteer time when we are healthy and free from symptoms.

- ✓ We must always wear a mask when visiting the MBC.
- ✓ We must practice appropriate social distancing.

- ✓ We must use the hand sanitizers at the MBC each time we walk past one.
- ✓ We must clean up after ourselves to make sure the MBC is ready for the next gathering.
